TAX CAP INFO

Years of sound budget management makes our Library eligible to increase our 2019-2020 budget by more than 2% while staying within the 2019 tax cap.

The calculation for the allowable tax levy is based on the increased tax base growth factor and the unused, allowable carryover from the prior year.

Per the NYS Comptroller, the allowable tax cap for the Manhasset Public Library is 4.45%. Our proposed budget details a 2.9% increase.

The 2019-2020 proposed budget does not include all the tax credits that NYS allows; we have only requested the amount we need to cover fixed costs, so we can continue to provide uninterrupted services and resources for our community.

2018 HIGHLIGHTS

ADULT SERVICES

- 27,530 people participated in 847 program sessions, including ballroom dance, exercise, concerts, lectures, and discussions of current events, books, films and more
- The History Center at Manhasset Library has presented two exhibits for our lobby, as well as providing access to our historical materials and helping over 50 people researching Manhasset and its history.
- Our meeting rooms hosted 169 community meetings and events, and our study rooms were used 3,183 times.
- Our 8,742 library card holders are taking advantage of using the Library from home to download books, magazines, movies, music, and more, with over 18,039 downloads.
- Our staff has provided 115 one-on-one Digital Literacy Sessions enabling more patrons to access our digital offerings.
- We continued to expand our Free Museum Pass program, adding the Guggenheim Museum, Frick Collection, New York Historical Society and Empire Pass. In addition to Pick Up/Return passes, we now have Grab & Go and Print on Demand options.

YOUTH SERVICES

- Over 8,000 children participated in 544 programs throughout the year.
- We continued to emphasize early literacy in Baby Bookworms, Storytime for Tots, & Alphabet Storytime.
 Older children enjoyed Kindergarten & Afterschool Storytimes and our Book Clubs for grades 3-8 encouraged leisure reading.
- Regular programming included Teen Paint Nites, Art Club, crafts, Chinese calligraphy & origami to tap into the creative spirit.
- Ongoing school visits ensure that Kindergarten and first grade students have library cards.
- We hosted a summer reading workshop attended by teachers and incoming seventh graders; and a "book tasting" for secondary school teachers and librarians.
- 95 teens volunteered over the summer, logging in over 1,000 hours of community service, helping them achieve their goals for service awards.
- We were able to facilitate and host a Girls Who Code club adapting curriculum provided by the National Organization, Girls Who Code. Other new programs included Coding for Cubs, and creating music using Earsketch.
